GUIDELINES

(Please read carefully)

The Little People's Golf Championships Association (LPGCA) takes great pride in its players, its host facilities and the community involvement of the Pepsi Little People's Golf Championships (PLPGC) and the Pepsi LP Collegiate Golf Championships (PLPCGC). In order to continue to provide an enjoyable event for everyone, the LPGCA requires its participants to adhere to a set of guidelines, which is to be followed both on and off the golf course throughout the duration of the tournament. The 2010 PLPCGC officially begins at noon on Sunday and continues through the final prize presentation on Wednesday.

CODE OF CONDUCT – Violations of the Code of Conduct include: verbal or physical abuse of any person, club throwing, cheating, disrespect of volunteers or officials, abuse of the golf course (divots not replaced, bunkers not raked, ball marks not repaired), discarded trash not placed in proper receptacle, vandalism, use of smoking or chewing tobacco products, use of drugs or alcohol, not adhering to dress code, leaving course during a competition round without permission of a PLPCGC official, or any other conduct not becoming a PLPCGC participant. Competitors who violate the Code are subject to a two-stroke penalty or disqualification, dependent on PLPCGC Tournament Committee decision. Players and parents should always conduct themselves in a professional manner while at event site. Under no circumstances will displays of temper or abuse, by players or parents, either verbally or physically, be tolerated, and such acts will result in the permanent suspension of all parties involved from all tournament courses for the duration of the tournament, and possibly future tournaments. Other complaints or violations not specifically covered will be reviewed by the Tournament Committee which will then determine the final action.

COMPETITION – All play shall be governed by current USGA Rules of Golf and its Decisions, and, where applicable, by Local Rules, Conditions and Definitions, subject to changes or amendments by the PLPCGC Rules Committee (2010 Tournament Information). PLPCGC tournament officials at the competition course will be in charge of tournament activities at that course. Decisions of PLPCGC officials are final.

DRESS CODE – Proper attire is required on golf course, practice tee and practice greens. Any violation will result in the player not being allowed to participate until he/she has met the following regulations. The dress code prohibits shoes having metal spikes, short shorts, tank tops, halter-tops, bare midriffs, T-shirts, denim shorts and jeans, and headphones. All hats and caps must be worn properly; collared shirts, turtlenecks or mock turtles may be worn and must be tucked in (girls may wear a collarless shirt if it is part of a coordinated outfit). Offensive slogans, language and/or pictures on clothing will not be tolerated.

STARTING TIMES – Rule 6-3a of the USGA Rules of Golf provides: "The player shall start at the time established by the Committee." The penalty for breach of this Rule is disqualification. However, it is a condition of the competition that, if a player arrives at his/her starting point, ready to play, within five (5) minutes after that starting time, in the absence of circumstances which warrant waiving the penalty of disqualification, the penalty for failure to start on time is two strokes at the first hole.

CADDIES AND CARTS -- No player may ride in a powered golf cart during his/her competitive rounds. Players in Men's and Women's Collegiate Divisions may **not** have a caddy and must walk and carry his/her own bag or use a pull cart.

PACE OF PLAY – Rules 6-7 of the USGA Rules of Golf states: "The player shall play without undue delay." The penalty for breach of Rule 6-7 is two strokes in stroke play. The penalty for repeated offense is disqualification. The first group of the day will be considered out of position if it takes more than 15 minutes to complete any hole. Subsequent groups will be considered out of position if they fall behind the group ahead and take more than 15 minutes per hole. Players in a group who are out of position will be monitored until the group is back in position. Each player will be given 45 seconds to play a shot. Timing of the player will begin when it is his/her turn to play. If the player exceeds the time limit, he/she will be given a warning. Rule 6-7 goes into effect for a repeated offense.

PLAYER'S RESPONSIBILITIES – Carry enough liquid in your golf bag for at least nine holes. Carry a current USGA Rules Book and the PLPCGC Tournament Information in your bag and know how to find answers. Know the **Definitions** in the USGA Rules Book. Contestants may **NOT** have cell phones or pagers on course during competition. Range finders are not allowed during competition. See PLPCGC Policies.

SCORING – Players in Men's and Women's Collegiate Divisions must exchange scorecards within their group and are responsible for recording the competitor's score after each hole. It is the competitor's responsibility to check his/her card after the completion of each round before signing it. **Every scorecard must be signed by competitor and scorer before being turned in to Scorer's Table.** Each competitor should wait at Scorer's Table until his/her card has been checked and competitor is dismissed by the PLPCGC scorer. Competitor is responsible for hole-by-hole score only. **Parents must not become involved with scoring.**

SPECTATORS – Spectators are welcome and may follow players in all Divisions, but **may not communicate with them** in any manner at any time during their competition round. Clapping and encouragement for good play are allowed as long as it does not interfere with tournament play. Contestants are reminded of Rule 8-1 concerning advice and receiving assistance: Penalty two strokes. Contestants are responsible for actions of parents/spectators and are reminded that significant contact/conversation may be construed as advice by fellow competitors. Spectators are encouraged to come out and watch the players compete on their own. Spectators are requested to **turn off** cell phones or pagers on the golf course during competition.

TIES – Ties for 1st through 2nd places in each Division shall be decided by hole-by-hole playoff immediately following conclusion of play in each Division. Ties for other places will remain as ties. In the case of darkness or adverse weather conditions, ties may be decided by hole-by-hole putt-off or matching cards backwards, starting with final hole played, or other method determined by Club Representative. Gift Certificates for 1st through 5th place will be given.

NOTE: After reading thoroughly and carefully the Guidelines on this page, and the Terms of Entry Acceptance on page 4, the applicant must sign on page 2 under PLPCGC GUIDELINES AND TERMS OF ENTRY ACCEPTANCE.

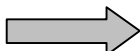

2010 TERMS OF ENTRY ACCEPTANCE

Please send completed entries only. A completed entry consists of (1) completed ENTRY FORM; (2) completed RELEASE FORM, signed by player; (3) Copy of Birth Certificate or Passport if a new player; (4) Handicap Index, Handicap Card, or scoring average and par; (5) PLPCGC GUIDELINES AND TERMS OF ENTRY acceptance signed by player, and (6) CORRECT ENTRY FEE.

Entries are accepted on a first-received basis. Space is limited in both divisions. A completed entry will be accepted or, if the division is filled, be placed on a waiting list. If any entry is not complete you will be notified immediately. Entries may be sent by regular or Priority mail, Fed Ex, Express Mail, Air Express, DHL or UPS, or may be faxed or emailed. Payment may be made by check, money order, or Visa or Mastercard.

Please DO NOT use any staples.



WITHDRAWAL POLICY -- One-half entry fee will be refunded if entry is withdrawn prior to 6 pm on Monday, May 31. **NO REFUND AFTER MAY 31.**

Please be sure that you read the terms of entry acceptance and the PLPCGC guidelines thoroughly and sign in specified places on page 2 of Entry Form. Signature of applicant is required.

THE MISSION OF THE LPGCA

The Little People's Golf Championships Association (LPGCA) is a 501 (c) (3) not-for-profit organization dedicated to providing a positive competitive environment for junior golfers ages three through seventeen (3 through 17) through the Pepsi Little People's Golf Championships, and to men and women ages eighteen through twenty-one (18 through 21) through the Pepsi LP Collegiate Golf Championships, and to assisting in the growth and development of every young man or woman who seeks a college scholarship through junior golf competition.

By dedicating itself to this purpose, the LPGCA has built a reputation as one of the largest and most prestigious junior golf tournaments in the world.

Since its inception in 1974, the LPGCA has pursued this mission through the Pepsi Little People's Golf Championships, and since 2009 through the Pepsi LP Collegiate Golf Championships, scheduled the Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday following Father's Day each June.

In keeping with its dedication to help young people, the LPGCA has established its "**Kids Helping Kids**" program, which encompasses (1) the **Tri-State Junior Golf Association**, which conducts one-day tournaments within the tri-state area; (2) **Little People's Charitable Program**, in which part of the proceeds from the tournament go to local and national charitable organizations involving young people, and (3) **Little People's Scholarship Program**, which provides scholarships for youngsters who would not otherwise be able to compete in an international junior golf event.

The LPGCA is a 501 (c) (3) not-for-profit organization established under the guidelines set by the Internal Revenue Service. Contributions to the Association are thus tax deductible by individuals and corporations alike.

The LPGCA is governed by a Board of Directors elected by its Advisory Team Members and is headed by Executive Director Nan Ryan.
