

Pepsi Little People's Virtual Tournament FAQ Page

1. What to do if there is bad weather on your competition day?

You have 7 days to get in your two rounds; the days do not have to be consecutive or on the same course. For 10-18-year olds, we do need to know the course, city, state and color tees of whatever course(s) you play.

2. What information do you need for the golf course(s) I play?

Players ages 3 - 9, should play a course comparable in yardage to the yardage shown on the Virtual Entry Form.

For 10-18 year olds, we need the following

- Name of course
- Location of course (city and state)
- Pro or manager name, phone number and email
- Color of tees you play

3. How do you equalize the playing field for the 10-18-year olds? What formula do you use?

We have established a Handicap Index and a Course Handicap for each age division based on the scores recorded for the last three years at Westview Golf Course. We look up the course you play in the USGA Course Rating and Slope Database and plug those stats into the USGA Course Handicap Calculator to determine the player's handicap at that course. The score is adjusted by the difference in course handicap between Westview and the course played. Strokes are added if the course played is rated by the USGA as an easier course than Westview and subtracted if it is a harder course.

4. When does registration end?

5. What forms do I need to fill out for the Virtual Tour?

If you have already entered the 2020 Pepsi Little People's, we just need the Virtual Entry Form. If you have not yet entered the 2020 Pepsi Little People's, you must fill out Part 1 (pages 1-2) of the regular Pepsi Little People's entry form in addition to the virtual entry form. We also need a copy of your birth certificate or passport. All forms are on our website, www.littlepeoplesgolf.com. If entering the Virtual event, the entry fee is only \$30. You do NOT need to pay an entry fee for the regular Little People's.

6. How does the Virtual tournament work?

All players in the Virtual event are on their honor to abide by the USGA Rules at the course(s) they play. Players 3-11 may have a caddy and may accept advise from said caddy. Players 12-18 must carry their own bag or use a pull cart, and may NOT accept advise from anyone. All scorecards must be signed by player and attested by playing

partner. Scores for 10-18 year olds will be adjusted according to the USGA calculator to level the playing field. 7. Can I play both rounds back to back on the same day?

Yes. You can play your rounds on the same day, or two different days, and on two different golf courses if you wish. We just need the appropriate information for whatever golf courses(s) you play.

8. If a rules question arises that is not settled with playing partner, should I consult with the golf pro/manager or contact Little People's?

Any rules question should be settled by the pro or rules person at the golf course you play, BEFORE you sign the scorecard.

9. Are green fees at the courses(s) I play included, or are they the responsibility of the competitor?

Any greens fees for a player competing in the Virtual Little People's are the responsibility of the player.

10. Are there minimum yardage requirements per age group.

There are yardage recommendations for the 3-9 year olds (see virtual entry form.) For players 10-18, you need to play a regulation course, and we need the course name, city, state and color tees you play.
